#### Museum Report

"A museum is a building or institution that cares for and displays a collection of artefacts and other objects of artistic, cultural, historical, or scientific importance. Many public museums make these items available for public viewing through exhibits that may be permanent or temporary. The largest museums are in major cities throughout the world, while thousands of local museums exist in smaller cities, towns, and rural areas.

Museums have varying aims, ranging from the conservation and documentation of their collection, serving researchers and specialists to catering to the public. The goal of serving researchers is not only scientific but intended to serve the general public."

When the Museum of Nursing History was moved from its original site in 2014 from Lady Lamington Nurses Home to Building 19, there was a great reduction in size not only for displaying the collection, but there was also no storage and work area, kitchen and office to list those areas available.

All these were available in the 400 square meters of floor space at Lady Lamington. Building 19 has only 90 square meters of floor space the most of which is taken up by the display cases and other selected memorabilia. Every effort has been made to provide displays to stimulate public interest. This goal has certainly been achieved as all visitors to the museum sign a Visitors Book which contains very positive comments about their visit.

The big positive about Building 19 is that it has Air conditioning which in our climate is essential conservation wise. Not all objects require air conditioning but it certainly a must for the collection of paper products, archives, and books; photos and textiles, mainly uniforms. Another positive is Security; the Hospital Security keeps an eye on the building which is fitted with alarms. The Engineering Department has fitted extra lighting to the building and recently the Lock Smith has changed the locks. There is also a Security Keypad at the door. A security gate has been fitted to the entrance of the veranda.

As safety of the collection is well established it is essential that we work on documentation and conservation of the collection.

I again request interest of the members to volunteer to attend working bees at the museum in the coming months to assist to update the inventory of the retrieved collection which is in storage on the veranda of the museum.

With over 30 years of nursing experience her tireless dedication to improve the care of patients with breast disease culminated in the opening of the first nurse practitioner led clinic at St Andrew's War Memorial Hospital. Fast forward to 2024 and Natasha has become the first Nurse Practitioner employed by Genesis Cancer Care who has developed a Breast Cancer Wellness Clinic, to assist patients with their overall health and wellbeing as they transition out of acute treatment into longer term survivorship.
