Museum Report



Digitalising the collection has commenced, starting with scanning of the many photographs in our collection. The new printer scanner and laptop are a boost for the museum. These were obtained from the Community Gambling Benefits Grant received after the floods of 2022. Every effort is made in conservation of the nursing collection. It is essential that an effort is made for Best Museum Practice to protect and conserve the archives, nursing books,

framed and non-framed photos, photograph albums, textiles and objects used for nursing procedures in the past.

It is of interest that nursing training finished in hospitals in 1993 that is thirty-one years ago! The history of nurse training began in 1885 with the first graduated completing in 1888 that is 139 years ago. The book "Bearers of the Tradition" by Helen Gregory and Cecilia Brazil was published in 1993 and Helen Gregory's book, A Tradition of Care in 1988.

The collection represents the Historical and Cultural inheritance of Nursing at the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital and the Royal Children's Hospital. Our History and Culture. Let's protect the legacy together!

Lady Norman Building

We have received a request for information in relation to the history of the Lady Normal Wing here at RBH. As you might recall this building is directly opposite the Edith Cavell Building.



The Lady Norman building was erected in 1895 as part of the expansion of the Brisbane Hospital for Sick Children. It comprised four main wards and is the only building surviving from the former Royal Children's Hospital complex. The building was designed by JJ Clark, one of Australia's leading architects in the 19th century. It was, at the time, the state of the art in hospital design based on the pavilion plan principles of providing plenty of light and ventilation. Despite recent internal changes to the building, the original planning as a pavilion plan ward block survives. One of the more unusual and striking features of the building is a room on the first floor - the former operating theatre. This room is distinguished by a set of large windows and also a lantern or skylight to maximize natural light. The room has changed little since 1895 and demonstrates what operating theatres were like in the 19th century. They were simple spaces unlike contemporary theatres with sophisticated equipment and facilities. This theatre in the Lady Norman wing is the oldest surviving theatre in Queensland.

The Lady Norman wing is an important part of the story of health care services for children in Queensland and is entered on the Queensland Heritage Register.
