## **OUR OBJECTIVES**

Under the Green Metro North – Sustainability Strategy 2021-2026, the Green Metro North Sustainable Procurement Implementation Plan outlines the commitment towards improving environmental sustainability, corporate governance and accountability through responsible procurement practices.

The plan aims to reduce the environmental impact of consumption, ensure human rights are upheld and modern slavery is prevented, and enhance energy efficiency and reduce emissions in line with Queensland Government targets with the end goal of Net Zero by 2050.

This is achieved through:

- Proactively reducing waste generation at the source
- Increasing product stewardship
- Shortening supply chains
- Contributing to circular economy principles
- Establishing actions that increase supply stream transparency and responsibility consistent with upholding planetary health.

#### **OUR INITIATIVES**

- Embedding minimum sustainability requirements in procurement tenders, contracts and supply arrangements.
- Establishing mandatory requirements for vendors and suppliers to demonstrate they have a verifiable and measurable Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) framework or policy.
- Utilising Memorandums of Understanding with contractors and partners (including for projects) that support commitment to sustainability.
- Introducing sustainability concepts and frameworks such as Product Stewardship, Circular Economy, Lifecycle Analysis and Environmental Product Declarations into procurement tenders and contracts.
- Ensuring more holistic cost benefit analysis processes are utilised when conducting procurement activities such as applying full lifecycle costs including disposal, to accurately measure cost impacts or cost savings associated with purchasing more sustainable products.
