#### **Keynote Speaker: Professor James Ward**

Professor James Ward is a Pitjantjatjara and Narungga man, an infectious diseases epidemiologist and a national leader in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander research. He is the Director of the Poche Centre for Indigenous Health at The University of Queensland. He has over 180 peer reviewed publications, and is known for his commitment to impactful research, and building the next generation of researchers. He is an ARC Laureate and a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Health and Medical Sciences.

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
